Class IV- Hindi Speech, Patriotic Song and Dance

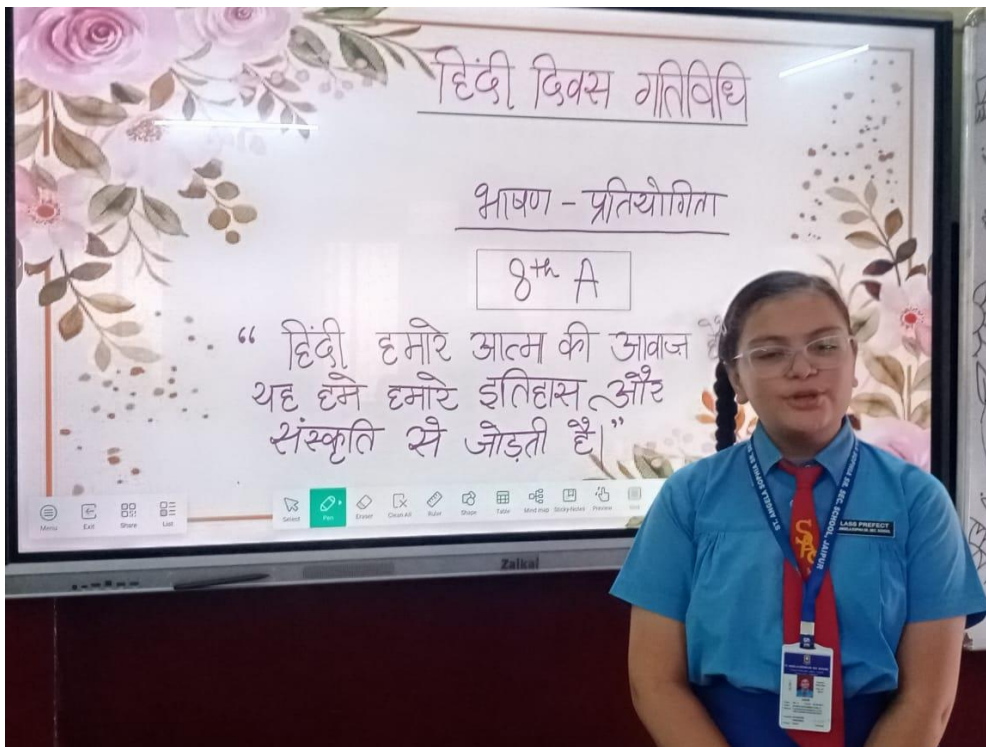
Class V- English Speech, Patriotic Song and Dance

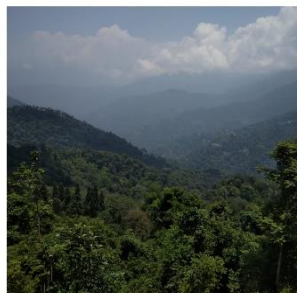
## Special Assembly - Remembrance of Rev. Mother Mary Matilda
